

Nellie (Nell) Bird

Feb 3, 1920 - Sept 16, 2024

Our beloved Nell Bird passed away on 16 September at the amazing age of 104. She gave us living proof that Scottish country dancers live long, healthy lives. Even after retiring from regular dancing, she led an active life at her seniors' home in Langley.

Nell started life as a Swiss farm girl!

According to her daughter Lynne, Nell was born in Roggwil, Switzerland, in February 1920 and came to Canada via the S.S. Melita in March 1923. She spent her early life on a Prairie farm with her six siblings. After visiting her brother in Vancouver in 1944, Nell moved to the west coast. She discovered Scottish country dancing through her neighbour, the late Frank Tschumi, and began dancing at the old Scottish Auditorium.

In 1980, Nell and her late husband John joined the Burnaby Intermediate class taught by Maggie Misfeldt. Over the years, she also danced with the Delta Borderers, Lady Aberdeen, the North Shore Seniors, and later the Thursday Thistles, and her friendly warmth endeared her to everyone. She performed with the Burnaby Entertainment Team and for years she looked after the catering at Burnaby Club functions. Nell was an expert cook, having worked as a professional baker, and many dancers have been treated to gifts of her delicious scones. The Burnaby Club honoured her with a lifetime membership, and on February 1, 2020, members of the Club travelled to her retirement home in Langley to help her celebrate.


