Dance Around the World



On Saturday November 23, forty-four (44) dancers from the Vancouver area gathered at the Jubilee Hall in Burnaby to celebrate a wonderful world-wide event, DANCING AROUND THE WORLD.

We had great afternoon of camaraderie and dancing. The program was created in Scotland and circulated to groups all around the world so that no matter where you lived (or holidayed) you could dance the same dances on the same day celebrating 101 years of the RSCDS.

We found prerecorded versions of the designated tunes for each dance and four of our teachers – Kay, Alison, Katherine and Fran shared the briefing. Gail Urquhart, with some help from others, ensured we knew it was an international event when she decorated the hall with flags representing ALL countries around the world.



In Memory of Rosemary Coupe (1939 - 2024)



Sadly, we have lost a beloved dancer, teacher, tutor, editor and historian who devoted much of her life to Scottish Country Dancing.

Rosemary was born in Hobart, Tasmania; an early influence was her musical grandmother of Scottish descent. She came to Vancouver in 1962, under the Commonwealth Scholarship plan, to do her PhD in English at UBC. Hugh Thurston was her

first teacher of Scottish country dancing in an old army hut on the UBC campus. Rosemary credited his expertise in dance history as another strong influence on her life and interests.

Rosemary married Robert Coupe in 1970. They were very active in the BC Mountaineering Club, as well as enjoying frequent summer camping in the BC Coastal range and hiking with their sons. Her 30-year career teaching English at Capilano College included three years as coordinator of the English department. Rosemary was also the founding Convenor of the Writing Centre.

In 1990 Rosemary obtained her RSCDS teaching certificate. She taught Gleneagles and then Burnaby from 1990 until December 2022. During that time, she led the Burnaby Entertainment Team which danced at many seniors' homes. She was a member of both the Vancouver Branch Demonstration Team and Barbara Campbell's Inverary Dancers.

Rosemary was the founding editor of the White Cockade branch newsletter and produced 10 issues a year for 13 years. In those days photos were taken to the printer to be screened, then a paste-up was done for the master copy; a far cry from the convenience of today's computers.

Historical research was a passion of hers, and Rosemary published the definitive article on the history of the Eightsome Reel. She produced a wonderful book on the history of Scottish Country Dance in Vancouver, as well as numerous articles on general dance history. She was the editor of the RSCDS magazine, Scottish Country Dancer, for three years and worked on the RSCDS Teaching Manual.

With Robert, Rosemary had three sons lain, Malcolm (Katherine) and Andrew (Andrea). Her Grandchildren are Annaliesa, Rowan, Rosie, Isa, and Alastair. Rosemary passed away peacefully on her own terms, at home, surrounded by family.

Rosemary will be sadly missed by all who knew her.

Rosemary Coupe - A personal note



I've been fortunate to have had a close friendship with Rosemary ever since I offered to play piano for the Burnaby classes! I soon learned that playing solo for a class took more practice than I could manage, but I got addicted to that lovely group and stayed on as a dancer. Rosemary had an admirable way of teaching beginners and making them feel comfortable within the more experienced

class; a precedent which is quite challenging. She was a mentor and role model for me, and I am often reminded of her motto "Don't touch dancers; that removes their autonomy". Practical advice indeed and sometimes hard to follow! Rosemary was always open to being consulted about dancing and teaching concerns. She gave me many good suggestions for programming, even helping me this fall to devise my Hallowe'en dance Spooky Spiderweb.

Rosemary was devoted to her family and when her husband Robert became ill, she gave up her teaching position to be there for him. Diane Coulombe taught the club for those two years. She returned to her role as teacher when Diane moved east and Robert's health improved.

The Entertainment Team was an annual endeavour, where Rosemary included newer members and used dances on our club's party program to give us extra practice. It was a mind-boggling effort involving complex scheduling of partners, positions and dates. We danced at many seniors' homes for their Robbie Burns events.







Rosemary was a great vegetarian cook. In September 2022, when she agreed to Chair the 2023 Heather Ball Committee, she prepared an elaborate meal for our first meeting. Not long after that, she

She was the epitome of perseverance and grit in facing three sessions of chemotherapy. Rosemary kept up her walks around Deer Lake, usually taking a break to sit on the memorial bench she had placed there for Robert. She accepted her poor health without self-pity and welcomed visits and calls from friends, though thankful for an offer to reschedule if it was an off day. With the help of her sons Andrew and Malcolm, she lived her last two years with dignity. Rosemary will be sorely missed.
