Upgrades to the Hall

Stucco Renovation

Three quotes have been received regarding the renovation of the stucco, the successful one coming in at \$25,000 to complete the whole building,

plus \$4000 to seal around the windows. This needs to be scheduled when it affects the renters the least. The goal is to complete this work over Spring 2026.

The women's bathroom

We appear to have been awarded \$16,000 towards this from the City (to be confirmed by Council), and we have raised over \$2000 so far (mainly from RSCDS donations). In order to accomplish the most for the money we have, the counters and sinks and flooring will be completed; the room repainted; the handicapped toilet replaced. Then it is anticipated that the rest of the toilets will be replaced in the next couple of years to spread out the costs.

Upstairs Toilet

One of the toilets off the Caberfeidh room flooded (fortunately clean water). This requires replacement of the toilet and replacement of the subfloor underneath which had warped.

Pictures

There used to be framed pictures of award winners in various Scottish activities on the west wall in the main hall. These had to be taken down frequently due to possible damage from sports activities. A digital version of these is being completed (to show on the screen in the lobby).

Treasurer's Report

The SCCS is in a good position financially.

A reminder to societies that September 30th is last day for submissions for next year's grants.

Website

The current SCCS website has to be migrated to a new platform. Work is being completed on a separate "Vancouver Scottish" website that would advertise all SCCS member societies and their activities, with funding links. The current SCCS website which advertises what the hall does (rentals etc) will migrate to the same platform, and have some minor upgrades. For the "Vancouver Scottish" website the goal is to complete by October 1st. We will keep you informed as it progresses.
